- C "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them a light has shone."

(Two purple candles and 1 pink candle are lit on the Advent wreath.)

- P Let us pray. O Lord Jesus Christ, the true Light who comes into the world to enlighten all peoples, bless us as we light the candles on this wreath in preparation for your coming. Enkindle our hearts with the fire of your love so that we may reflect your love to all—especially to those who are still walking in spiritual darkness around us; for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C Amen.

Confession & Absolution (from Isaiah 55:6-7)

- P Seek the Lord while he may be found;
- C call upon him while he is near;
- P let the wicked forsake his way,
- C and the unrighteous man his thoughts;
- P let him return to the Lord,
- C that he may have compassion on him,
- P and to our God,
- C for he will abundantly pardon.

- P Heavenly Father,
- C we come before you today with nothing to hide. You've heard everything we've said and seen everything we've done. You even probe our thoughts. You know that every day our lives are filled with disobedience, poorly chosen words and selfish ends. Forgive us for the sake of your Son, Jesus, who lived the perfect life that we could never live and sacrificed himself in our place. Amen.
- P "'Comfort, comfort my people,' says your God. 'Speak tenderly to her and proclaim to her: 'Your sins have been paid for'" (Isaiah 40:1-2).
